(2) There were 124 responses to the School Sentinel Survey that was sent out. The results were as follows: Strongly Support (56.10%), Somewhat Support (21.14%), Neutral (7.32%), Somewhat Do Not Support (7.32%), Strongly Do Not Support (8.13%). Spink County Sheriff has indicated that he would support the implementation of the program should we move in that direction.(3) Due to conflicts in the schedule we will not plan on having an elementary field day until next year. **Mrs. Lisa Frericks:** (1) Northwestern Area School District 56-7 has one school board vacancy.
