Certified Teachers who have taught the entire year will have coverage paid by the District through August 31 of that year or when their contract is paid out, whichever is earlier. **Dental Insurance, Vision Insurance, Voluntary** Life Insurance, AFLAC: You may participate in these insurances if you work over 20 hours a week. The District does not contribute any amounts toward this.
