# **Tuscherer Awarded for Numerous Achievements**

The South Dakota Volleyball Coaches Association named senior Jussy Tuscherer as the 2011 Class B Miss Volleyball.

Tuscherer has earned numerous school records in kills, aces and blocks. However, records are not all Tuscherer excels in: she has also received other impressive honors for each year of her career. Along with these, her phenomenal stats enabled her to be a perfect recipient for this title.

Tuscherer has demonstrated great skill with six school records. She is number one for most kills in a season with 577, and number two for kills efficiency in a season with .403. Tuscherer is also number one in career kills, finishing with a total 1,647 kills. She has earned the number two title for most career blocks with 273. With 303 total career aces, it's no surprise Tucherer is ranked number two with career aces, and number one in season aces with 118 in her senior season.

This season, Tuscherer finished

serving with an 87%. Leading in attacks, she successfully had 1,053 of

1161, a 40% kill efficiency. Tuscherer had 237 digs, 76 blocks, and passed at a 1.90 level with 77% efficiency. Tuscherer was honored Ace Server, Kills Leader, Points Leader, Blocking and Kill Efficiency Leader. She received Northwestern Player of the Year, All-Lake Re-

gion Conference player, the Aberdeen American News Athlete of the Week and All-AreaTeam, First Team All-State player, Class B All-Tournament Team player, KDLT Athlete of the Week, Academic All-State player,

Achievement Award.

In her career, Tuscherer performed above and beyond. Serving 1,110/1,268, 88%, she successfully served 303 aces. Tuscherer has an attacking record of 3,264/3,607, 36%. In her career, Tuscherer has 804 digs, 273 blocks, and a passing record of 675/982, 68%. Junior year, Tuscherer was Kills Leader, Kill

Efficiency Leader, Blocking Leader, Points Leader, Ace Server, in the First Team All-State, All-Lake Region Conference, Aberdeen American News player, Northwestern Player of the Year, and AVCA/MaxPreps

Duncan's most embarrassing moment was missing her first serve at district volleyball against Warner.


# Hahler Uses Artistic Style to Paint Mural

Frericks also plans to have an artist at NW add her third child, fourth-grader Cassidy Frericks, to the collection, when Cassidy gets to high school.


"Maddie did an excellent job on the mural, although it seems like an unlikely pose for my son," Mrs. Frericks said.
